Please close the gate after arriving and when leaving the pond.

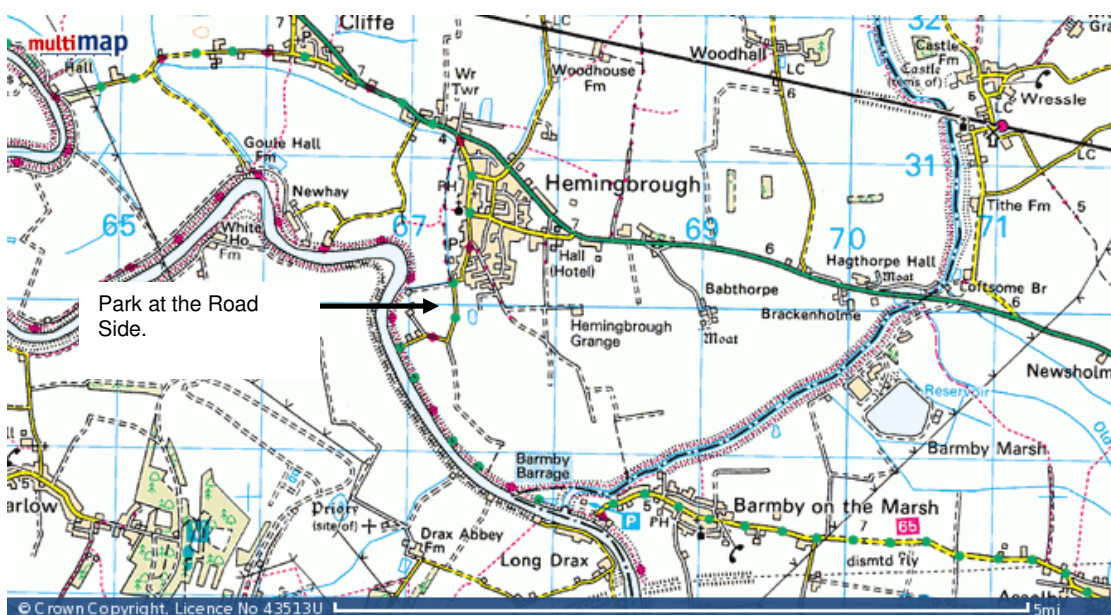
The pond is well stocked with roach and rudd which in summer respond well to maggot and caster fished up in the water, either on the pole or under a light waggler.

Whilst the average stamp of fish is small, fish to well over 1lb can be caught, particularly in the evening or early morning.

Perch can be caught using similar tactics, and specimens of between 2-3lb are not uncommon.

The pond holds a good head of tench, which patrol right up to the bank in many swims. It is therefore possible to catch them on the pole or waggler in the shallower swims, although feeder rigs score well in most places.

The tench are not huge; averaging 2-4lb. Bream of a similar stamp can be caught on similar tactics. The pond also holds crucian carp, but these are difficult to come by. Maggot, caster, sweet corn and pellet all score well.



From York, take the A19 to Selby. At Barlby turn left onto the A63 Hull Road. Stay on A63 and at Hemingbrough take the right turn onto Main Street signed "Village Centre". At the village post office turn right onto Landing Lane. Bear right then left to stay on Landing Lane. Parking is on the verge on the right. The pond is 100m on the left, the track passing between the two farm fields.
